

Guidelines for Making Choctaw Board Games

1. Use your Choctaw research information to make your playing cards or playing spaces on your game board.
2. Using the academic standards listed, create at least one question that covers each standard.
3. Type the rules for playing the game. Give step-by-step instructions for playing the game. Include the name of the game at the top of the instruction sheet.
4. Be creative! Make your game visually appealing.
5. Game pieces should reflect some aspect of the tribe researched. (Examples: miniature Choctaw basket, miniature stickball sticks, miniature drum, etc.)
6. Type the cards for the playing of the game. Cards may be laminated or covered with clear contact paper, if desired.
 - A. Answer may be on one side with the question on the other, or
 - B. The question may be on one side with a key included with the game.
7. Game must be tested by members of your group before being turned in for a grade.
8. See rubric to assure each item has been covered before turning the game in.
9. Create a container for playing pieces, cards, and other game elements. You may use materials like cereal boxes, plastic containers, etc.
